MOTHER JANET UPDATE

A number of children and staff at the orphanage have suffered with malaria and typhoid. The Headmaster, Mr Andrew Mwesigwa, had to be admitted to a medical centre for treatment during the summer. Typhoid can be very serious, resulting in death, if not detected straight away. The charity has ensured that testing kits are available so, when children and staff fall ill, they are able to receive immediate treatment as necessary. We thank those who raise funds for the medication but we would still like to appeal for further financial support in order to purchase more kits to cope with the demand.

For years, the football team at Mother Janet has performed exceedingly well,

becoming regular winners of the schools' cup in the district of Masaka. The performance of the team in this year's term two football season was phenomenal. In scorching heat, the boys tirelessly fought to keep the district cup. Winning the cup for several years in succession has placed the school at the forefront of promoting development and learning through sports and games.



UNICEF has reported that "when part of a school curriculum with proper instruction, sport has been shown to increase children's school attendance and their desire to succeed academically as well as teaching them life skills".

The provision of sports equipment to those at Mother Janet, via ALLHIM, has played a significant part in decreasing the dropout rate from school.

The Nursery class at Mother Janet were very happy indeed to receive toys and school equipment, purchased with money raised by Busy Bees' Playgroup, Blaenavon. They were so happy to have 'proper' toys to play with, rather than those they usually make themselves.

Meet **FLORENCE**, a very happy young lady who was brought to Mother Janet Orphanage at the age of 6. Florence's mother died when Florence was very young and her father died in a tragic accident when Florence was in her teens, leaving her an orphan with four other siblings. Tragedy also struck in her life when, in 2011, she lost her only sister, Jascent, at 18 years of age to typhoid.

Florence has always been very hard working and committed to her learning. Having been sponsored at the orphanage and supported in developing her study skills by members of the charity, Florence's success, to date, has enabled her to progress to university where

There are many other children like Florence who have succeeded, as a result of attending Mother Janet Orphanage. Across Uganda, only 44% of girls complete basic education. For Florence to reach this level of education is remarkable. We thank all our sponsors who, through their generosity and commitment, are changing lives in this way. ACTION FOR CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE (ACYP)

Members of the charity who visited Uganda this year were delighted to witness the improvement in the health and wellbeing of families supported through our partnership with ACYP. The difference witnessed in only 12 months was astonishing.

The needs in the communities continue to be extensive: orphaned children have to struggle to look after their siblings; elderly members of the community and disabled fight to live, with little or no food, or support and many young people continue to be abused by their extended families. With your financial support lives are being turned around and great things achieved.

A major focus in the last few months has been the need to provide nutritional meals for 90 children suffering from HIV/AIDS. They are receiving medication

via the Ugandan government but, without the correct nutrition, the medication will be of little benefit. Three of these children have died in the past three months.

The charity is actively seeking support for each of these 90 children to receive the regular meals required to improve their quality of life. Are you able to help? £2.00 per week (per child) is all that is required to resolve a life or death situation for these children. If you can help, please contact the charity.

Mary, the widow in the picture, suffers from HIV/AIDS. She is the main carer for

several children, the youngest of which are 2 year old twins, who also suffer from HIV/AIDS. To support the general health and wellbeing of families like Mary's, the charity funds the construction of plate racks which enable washed crockery to be dried and stored away from the attack of vermin. In many cases, the charity also supports these families by building a very small, basic kitchen, to enable food to be prepared in



a more hygienic way. The cost of this work is around £170 per family. Again, if you are able to help, please let us know.

The elderly lady in front of the metallic house (below) was homeless. Micheal and his volunteers recently built the temporary shelter you can see, for her and the abandoned children in her care. Micheal informs us that these children were so ill prior to the intervention with food provided by the charity that, without it, they would be dead. It is amazing what can be achieved with a relatively small contribution and what a life changing impact it has on those affected.
