

MOTHER JANET UPDATE

With your support, the following improvements have recently been made:



A project to extend three classrooms at the school has now been completed and the children were able to use the facilities at the start of the new term in May. The fully decorated classrooms have been equipped with new desks and new textbooks have been provided for pupils in all classes at the school. We thank God for this provision.

A further *solar panel* has been installed which will provide light in upper school classrooms and the library block. An additional 16 *bunk beds* have been bought to accommodate the increased number of children living at Mother Janet.

energy-saving New ovens have been provided for use in the school kitchen. The installation of these ovens now means staff will no longer need to use open wood fires and have been reduced costs because less wood is needed to provide the heat required to prepare the food for children and staff



POULTRY PROJECT



Rev John has started a small poultry project at the school, which has enabled him to teach the older boys some poultry farming skills. The project will also provide eggs to improve the diet of the pupils and staff at the school.

Rev John's aim is to expand the project further to create a small income for the Orphanage School by selling eggs and chickens.

It is planned to build another section in the near future to enable this expansion to take place.

The music worship was led by a visiting Gospel Group from Kampala and the Hope Choir from Mother Janet School. The gospel was preached and over 1000 people were fed a meal of chicken, rice and other vegetables, together with a bottle of soda. For many of these this would be the best meal they would have all year and was a real treat. Also during the trip ...

- > A computerised administration system for Mother Janet School was developed and staff trained in its use.
- > The library building was painted.
- > The gospel was preached at Crusades.
- > Food parcels were delivered to the poor in the local villages.



INTRODUCING THE SCHOOL'S RESIDENT NURSE

In the Easter newsletter we reported that the clinic had been completed and a resident nurse employed. During the visit at Easter we met Patience. Employed since February 2011, she says:

COMMUNITY WORK -

ACTION FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE UGANDA

In partnership with Micheal Mwebaza (Founder of Action for Children and Young People Uganda (ACYP)), ALLHIM is reaching out to the poor in the community.

For those living in extreme poverty, ACYP provides training in the skills



villagers need to support themselves and live a much healthier lifestyle, thus reducing susceptibility to diseases prevalent in the One very simple area. solution is to provide a pig or goat for the family to rear. In so doing, the animal's litter can be sold, providing a regular income. Over a short period of time (1-2 years) it

is hoped families will be able to support themselves and take them out of the poverty trap.

ALLHIM is excited to be part of this work, which will empower young people and their families to become self-sufficient.

SKILLS' CENTRE UPDATE - SECONDARY SCHOOL

During our Easter visit, research indicated that the establishment of a specialised Skills' Centre was not deemed the best option. Advice from Education Officials in Uganda indicated that any vocational skills' training should be offered alongside traditional O and A level subjects at one campus. This would enable pupils to choose the route that would best suit their needs and abilities - O and/or A level, Vocational, or a combination of both.

The land which has been purchased for this development is currently being used to grow crops and supply food for Mother Janet. This work will continue until such time as funds are available and building is ready to commence.

Please pray for the provision of finance to start the first phase of what will be a very exciting project.
