### MOTHER JANET UPDATE

This year, two orphans from Mother Janet have died. Both were suffering from HIV/AIDS and, due to their low immune systems, could not fight off illness. Tuberculosis claimed the life of Paul and malaria claimed Fahad's life. May their souls rest in eternal peace. It has been a sad time for the children and staff at the orphanage. However, despite all the sadness they may go through, there is always a radiant smile on their faces.

The charity has been able to purchase the medical kits to test for HIV/AIDS in the children we support. This enables us to provide them with the necessary diet and treatment which gives them a better quality and much longer life.

Working at Mother Janet is not just a day job. Staff have to be accommodated at the school in order to supervise the children day and night. We thank God for the provision of funds, enabling us to construct three rooms for staff accommodation. There is also a need to extend a classroom and dining room, due to the increasing number of children.



# COMMUNITY WORK ACTION FOR CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE (UGANDA)

Since we started the partnership with Action for Children and Young People Uganda, it is astonishing to see how many lives are being changed. The work is growing and the projects in the community have increased, now including animal keeping, supply of seeds to grow crops, donation of food parcels to poor/HIV families, hygiene programme and supporting children back into schools.

We witnessed a family which had sold the mother pig and used the money to pay for their medication and other supplies. On offering them food parcels, they refused saying that there were other families who needed them more. The head start we gave them, through the pig and goat project, as well as providing them with seeds to grow food, has enabled them to be self-sufficient and earn a living from selling the surplus. Some piglets were passed on to other families. This could never have happened without your generous support. There are more families who are in need of this support.



The children below have also benefitted from your support of the work of ACYP. All of them have disabilities but are able to participate in community and educational activities which enable them to develop, not only their social skills but also their confidence and self-esteem.

The team in Uganda thank God for the work and for your continued support.



### REAL LIFE STORIES

Meet PENINNA, a widow who has her hands full looking after her two disabled grandchildren who are also HIV positive. Alex, and his cousin Dennis, contracted HIV from their parents (Peninna's son and daughter) who passed away, leaving her with the two boys. Alex is blind, unable to sit or walk, and lies on a mat day and night.

When Peninna goes to the field all day to get food for the boys, she leaves Alex and Dennis in the house, with no-one to care for them. Dennis, who has learning difficulties, just wanders about. Peninna says life is very hard, especially in her old age, as she has to carry Alex to give him personal care. Peninna is very grateful for the help she receives from ACYP. ALLHIM charity, working in partnership with ACYP, reaches out to those who are destitute like Peninna, Alex and Dennis giving them hope for the future.
